



- *Skills are taught and reinforced with literature books-both fiction and nonfiction

Phonics


*Assessments have been taken to assess phonological awareness and individual need for small group instruction in particular areas.'

Word Work

*Spelling words will be organized by word families, consonant sounds, long/short vowels, consonant blends, digraphs, suffixes, prefixes, compound words, homophones, homonyms, high frequency words, and other spelling patterns.

*Weekly practice activities will be given for each word list-practice will include a variety of skills: syllables, alphabetical order, vocabulary, sentence building, word sorts, building words, using words in context, etc.






